#### WELCOME TO THE 2025 SIERRA PACIFIC SECTIONAL!

In the same way, we need to go through the seasons of "winter" with God as He deepens and strengthens the roots of our faith.

As we move into **spring**, camp is a flurry of activity as we prepare for the summer season. It's a busy time of building and growth. Similarly, in our relationship with God or seasons within ministry, a "spring" season might feel like the start of something new, and carry with it a sense of hope.

It is our hope and prayer that as we gather for this conference, that we'll be able to spend time with God, with ourselves and with each other. As we spend time resting, reflecting, connecting and learning, we hope that you will experience in a deeper way God's great love for you; and that as you embrace God's love, that it will also deepen your love for Him, and your love for others. Regardless of what "season" you're in - at camp, in ministry, in your relationship with God - we hope that you will see that God is actively present with you in that season, and that He makes everything beautiful in its own time.

He has served in various roles, including President of Ethnic Affairs in Peru and positions at the Inter-American Development Bank and UNICEF. Miguel is an advocate for indigenous rights and has established several ministries. Miguel has three daughters and continues to work passionately for the betterment of Peru and its people.

Join Miguel as he shares his inspiring life story, highlighting his journey from his beginnings in the Amazon Rain Forest to where God has him today. 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
